Affidavit of R [REDACTED] M [REDACTED]

Comes Now, R [REDACTED] M [REDACTED], being duly sworn by an officer authorized to administer oaths, and hereby states the following:

1. My name is R [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] I am over 18 and competent to make this affidavit.
2. I served as a juror during Warren King's murder trial in Bayley, GA in 1998.
3. I listened carefully to the evidence at Mr. King's trial and took notes throughout the proceedings. I took my responsibility as a juror seriously and decided on the death penalty because I thought it was the right verdict based on what I knew at the time.
4. I remember both Warren King and Walter Smith testifying about the night of the crime. At the time, I believed Mr. Smith's testimony as to how the crime occurred. Still, I believed that Mr. Smith deserved to ~~be~~ spend his life in prison ^{even} for the role in the crime that he admitted to.
5. I have recently been contacted by representative of the Georgia Resource Center in Atlanta, GA. They informed me that Walter Smith is serving

a parolable life sentence. It seems unfair to me that Mr. Smith should be able to get out of prison just because he was allowed to do a plea bargain.

6. I was also shown an affidavit by a crime scene expert, Wayne Hill. ~~The~~ The information I learned from it would have been extremely important to me at Mr. King's trial. It would have changed my mind about ~~who's~~ whose version of the crime to believe. Even more, it would have changed ^{my} mind about giving Warren King the death penalty.

7. Based on Mr. Hill's analysis of the crime scene and the time lapse before the gunshots, I no longer believe Mr. Smith's testimony was credible. It now seems that he may have fabricated this ~~is~~ story so that he could get a plea bargain. It also seems even more unfair to me now that Walter Smith got a life sentence and Warren King got the death penalty.

8. I now feel strongly that Mr. Smith is just as, if not more, responsible for Mr. Crosby's death than Mr. King. Because of that I do not believe Mr. King should have received a more harsh punishment. I would be comfortable with Mr. King's sentence being commuted to life without parole. I believe that would be a just punishment, and I do not feel it would undermine what we decided on as a jury.
